QUILTS ON DISPLAY

NORTH CHARLESTON ART FEST CELEBRATING BLACK MUSIC

African American contributions to music has been great and varied. Once a musical genre has been absorbed into American culture, the originators, the groundbreakers are often left out of the discussion especially if they are Black.

Rock N Roll, the Blues, Gospel all have their roots with the Africans who were brought here. Rock, and Rock n Roll, have left off the names of pioneers of the musical genre.

LaQuita Tummings' quilt was shown in the North Charleston Art Fest in May. The challenge for the 17th annual exhibit was for artists to create fiber art pieces that honor and uplift Black Music and musicians. The label on the back of her quilt names over 100 guitarists starting with Lead Belly in 1888 to present time. The list of African American guitarist, male and female, is far from complete. The guitars on her quilt represent some of the instruments used by these trail blazers

Other AAQGO members participants included **Ora Clay**, **Teri Green** and former member **Niambi Kee**.

SEW-LANO QUILTS: A PATTERN OF CHANGE Vacaville Museum June 22nd through September 21st



The exhibit features art quilts by the **Sewlano Fiber Artist Network** and showcases 20 of their artists and 41 art quilts. Most of the quilts are from technique classes taught over the last six years by AAQGO member Teri Green and other teachers. Several AAQGO members are included in this exhibit: **Amal Johnson, Evelyn Johnson, Deborah Reed-Salmon, Ora Clay, Sally Dickson and Teri Green**.

On June 27th, the first artist showcase was by AAQGO member **Deborah Reed-Salmon** who shared her quilt journey over the last 20+ years. Deborah shared beautiful traditional quilts, many of which are made with African Ankara fabrics, and always bright and colorful fabrics. On July 13th, **Ora Clay** was the featured artist and showcased her amazing collection of story and pictorial quilts. Ora previously taught her pieced background technique and several of those quilts are in the show.

ACTA MENTOR/APPRENTICE PROGRAM





African American Quilt Guild of Oakland (AAQGO) members, Marsha Carter and Zondra Martin successfully completed the 2023-2024 Alliance for California Traditional Arts (ACTA) Mentor/Apprentice Program.

The Apprenticeship Program encourages the continuity of California's thriving traditional arts and cultures by contracting mentor artists to offer intensive, one-on-one training to eligible apprentices who demonstrate a committed engagement with, and a talent for, a specific traditional art form or cultural practice.

Marsha and Zondra, committed to the program and themed their year long journey, "AFRICAN AMERICAN HISTORICAL TRADITIONAL QUILTING: GATEWAY TO THE SOUL OF 21ST CENTURY AFRICAN AMERICAN FIBER ART", and dedicated their work to their enslaved African American foremothers who while enslaved toiled (for free), from "cain't see to cain't see."

The duo spent the year in concentrated learning, discussing and channeling how their foremothers spent their days on plantations and in wealthy households. The enslaved women were needed for spinning, weaving, sewing and quilting. That left little time in the day for them to do their own sewing, so they sewed scrap quilts into the nights by candlelight and fireplace light to provide bedcovers for the comfort and warmth of their loved ones.

During the year, Zondra bravely completed five works of art, while enduring a serious health crisis. She made two hand pieced, hand quilted traditional quilts(**one dubbed "the nine footer**), one hand pieced digital photo memory wall quilt, with hand pieced blocks made by her mother, one wall art hanging, featuring First Lady Michelle Obama and one machine pieced and machine quilted (with a special quilted Sankofa design), African fabric strip quilt.

Zondra continues the art of hand piecing and hand quilting of her maternal foremothers and learned the art from her grandmother and mother.

The ACTA Mentor/Apprentice Program culminated with a Public Sharing of Zondra's creative works, on May 25, 2024, at the Oakland Public Library, West Oakland Branch.
