

Block #19 - Pyramids Block

Finished Block Size 12 X 12 inches



Welcome to The 50 Blocks in 50 Weeks Quilt Along with Sparrow Quilt Co! Each week we will release a new block featuring Painter's Palette Solids by Paintbrush Studio. You can find video tutorials on our website at sparrowquiltco.com and on The Sparrow Quilt Co Youtube channel.

Below, you will find cutting and piecing instructions for a single Pyramids Block. Please read the entire pattern over before beginning. A quarter inch seam should be used for all piecing. WOF is Width of Fabric. Typical Quilting Fabric is 43/44 inches wide.

Color = Dark

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS - SINGLE BLOCK

Navy - 4 in X WOF strip

White - 6in X WOF strip

2 colors - BKGRD=light (6) 3½ x3½ HST (B;E) will = B;E (6) 1 %x 1 % = F (Dark) (2) 32 x 32 = A (Dark) (2) 32x62 = D (Dark)

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

Navy - Cut 3 Squares 3 7/8 inch X 3 7/8 inches, then cut these each once on diagonal to yield 6 triangles. (B) (3) Light 12 x12= C

Cut 6 Squares 1 7/8 X 1 7/8 inches. (F)

Cut 2 rectangles 6 1/2 X 3 1/2 inches. (D)

Lastly, cut 2 squares 3 1/2 X 3 1/2 inches. (A)

White - Cut 3 Squares 3 7/8 X 3 7/8 inches, then cut these each once on diagonal to yield 6 triangles. (E)

Cut a strip 1 1/2inches wide, subcut 3 rectangles 12 1/2 X 1 1/2 inches. (C)

PIECING INSTRUCTIONS

Piece a white triangle to a navy triangle. Make six. Press to darker fabric. Trim all to 3.5 inches. (Diagram 1)

Mark the navy 1 7/8 inch squares with a diagonal line. Lay them on the white triangle just pieced. Stitch on the line, then trim away corner 1/4 inch from stitching line. Press to darker fabric. (Diagram 2) Make six.

Make (6) six 32 HST





Diagram One

Cut (6) six (F) 17/8 x 17/8 Corner units



Use the block diagram on the left to lay out your pieced and cut pieces.

You will have three rows to this block, assemble each row first, then attach white trim along bottom edge.

Join the three rows together to finish up the block.
