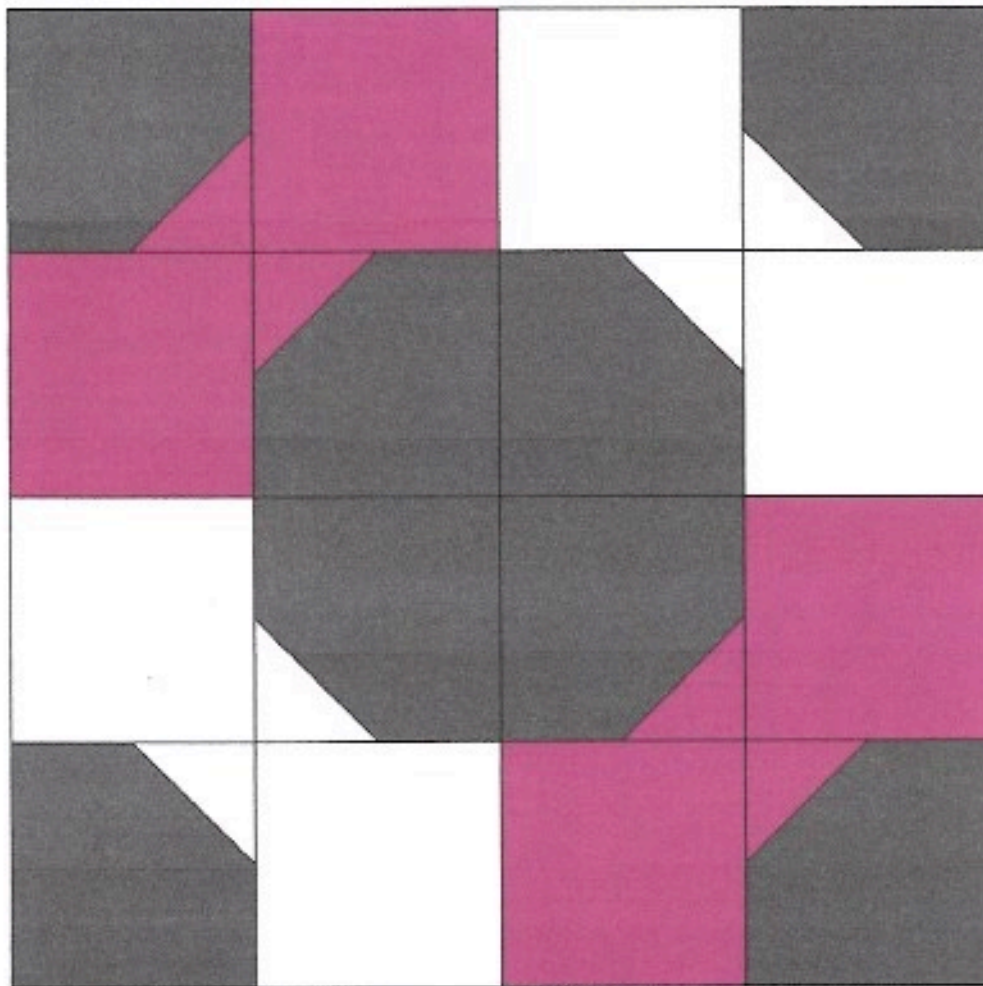

Welcome to The 50 Blocks in 50 Weeks Quilt Along with Sparrow Quilt Co! Each week we will release a new block featuring Painter's Palette Solids by Paintbrush Studio. You can find video tutorials on our website at sparrowquiltco.com and on The Sparrow Quilt Co Youtube channel.

Below, you will find cutting and piecing instructions for a single Bow Tie Wreath. Please read the entire pattern over before beginning. A quarter inch seam should be used for all piecing. WOF is Width of Fabric. Typical Quilting Fabric is 43/44 inches wide.

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS - SINGLE BLOCK

Grey - 3.5 X 28 inch strip
White - 3.5 X 26 inch strip
Fuchsia - 3.5 X 26 inch strip

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

Grey - Cut 8 squares, 3.5 X 3.5 inches.
White - Cut 4 squares, 3.5 X 3.5 inches.(A)
Cut 4 squares 2.25 X 2.25 inches. (B)
Fuchsia - Cut 4 squares, 3.5 X 3.5 inches.(A)
Cut 4 squares 2.25 X 2.25 inches. (B)

PIECING INSTRUCTIONS

Mark a diagonal line on the back of the White (B) and Fuchsia (B) squares. Place a (B) square on the corner of a grey square. Stitch on the drawn line. Trim 1/4 inch from stitching line to remove the outer corner. Press towards grey fabric. Make 4 Fuchsia and 4 White cornered grey units (shown on next page).

- 3 colors

*cut (4) of each color
3 1/2 x 3 1/2*

cut (4) of color 2 1/4 x 2 1/4

*cut (4) of another color
2 1/4 x 2 1/4*

*pick your color
for corner*



Now we can create small four patches which will form each bow tie. Stitch a Fuchsia(A) to a pieced grey/fuchsia corner unit. Ensure that the fuchsia corner is towards the fuchsia (B) square. Make four total. Make two four patch units ensuring they are laid out as shown in diagram below.

Repeat with white fabrics. Using block diagram on front page, layout the four patches you have created. Stitch them together in pairs and finish by joining the pairs to make your block.
